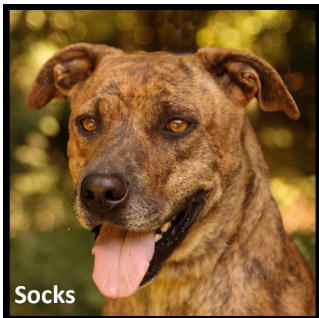

Why do dogs pant?

People sweat through their skin to cool down, but dogs can't do that! Dogs sweat through their paw pads, but panting helps air circulate through a dog's body to help them cool down. When it is hot outside, make sure your dog has plenty of water to drink and limit his time outdoors. If you want to walk your dog, try to walk him in the morning when it is cooler.

Dogs also pant if they get spooked, like during a thunderstorm or fireworks, or if they are not feeling well. Sometimes it can be a sign of an illness, so you should always pay close attention to your dog's behavior and take him to the vet if there is something unusual about his breathing.

This recipe is from the ASPCA and is a fun way to help keep your pet cool and entertained this summer!

Ingredients:

- Plain yogurt (be sure to check the label to ensure that yogurt doesn't contain xylitol.)
- Banana
- Peanut Butter

Blend equal parts of all three ingredients. Then, pour the mixture into 3 oz. plastic paper cups, filling them ¾ full. Instead of using traditional wooden popsicle sticks, use nylon bones to reduce the chances of choking or obstruction, and put one bone in each cup. Freeze for 3 hours and voila!

Pro-tip: Your pup might appreciate it if you let the pupsicle melt slightly before serving.
